Yearbook Club

Admissions Ambassadors

Admissions Representatives assist the Admissions Office by recruiting students and families to Arrupe. Throughout the course of the year they will help in Admissions events such as Shadow Days, Open House, 8th Grade Interviews, Freshmen Registration and Freshmen Orientation. During Shadow Days Admissions Representatives will serve as Shadow Hosts where they will be paired with an 8th grader for a day and will take the 8th grader with them to classes and lunch. For the remaining Admissions events, Admissions Representatives will be assigned specific tasks by the Admissions Office. Served hours count as community service hours.

AJHS Student Government

The Arrupe Student Government is composed of elected representatives from each class section and every club/activity. An Executive Board oversees meetings during every Activity Period to discuss weekly school events and plan future content for the student body.

Arrupe Student Tutors

Student tutors play an integral leadership role in the Arrupe community. Our goal is to provide academic support to any Arrupe Jesuit student. We believe that all students can achieve academic success, & we work together to make that a reality. Members commit to one or more days a week during 7th period or Saturday school to help their peers. Tutors will have the opportunity to meet with new people & be a part of their success.

CWSP Ambassadors & Student Leaders (CASL)

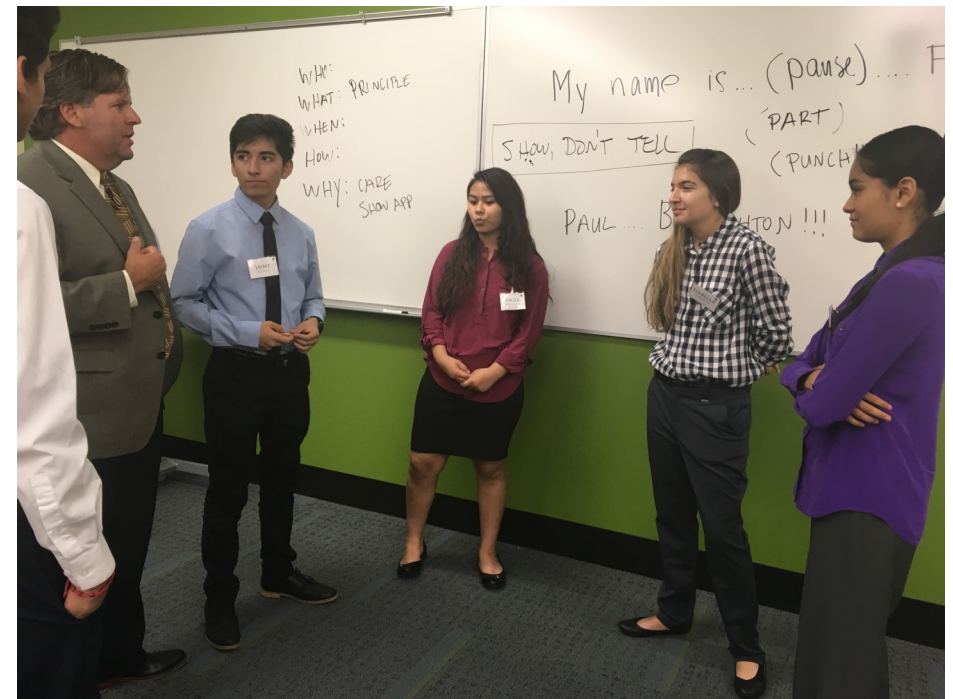
