
LEARN MORE ABOUT CWSP







Capital Campaign Update

In 2022, Arrupe Jesuit launched a bold plan with little more than a dream and a desire to help Colorado's most deserving students and families seek greater educational opportunities. In June of 2024, the Board of Trustees approved final plans to break ground on the \$46 million **Lead the Way: Imagining More for Arrupe Jesuit** project. This capital project intends to expand the Arrupe Jesuit campus to create space for 75 additional students. The expansion and renovation will create opportunities for more academic and extracurricular programming, including a new gymnasium and new science wing. This school year, incredible progress was made, with a little over 90% of the goal raised.
