MISSION OF ARRUPE JESUIT

Arrupe Jesuit High School is a Roman Catholic, co-educational, college preparatory school sponsored by the Jesuits of the USA Central and Southern Province. Arrupe Jesuit serves economically disadvantaged students from Denver's inner-city neighborhoods. By enhancing the human, intellectual, and spiritual capacities of our students through a rigorous, innovative, and affordable college preparatory education, we offer hope for a brighter future to some of Denver's neediest youth. Our goal is to empower graduates who will continue their education and return as leaders in their communities.

Arrupe Jesuit is accredited by AdvancED and is a member of the Jesuit Schools Network (JSN) and the Cristo Rey Network.

WHY ARRUPE JESUIT?

Arrupe Jesuit High School responds to a critical, local community need. There is a deplorable gap in school achievement between minority, low-income students and their peers in our state.

- Only 1 in 3 students who start Denver Public Schools in 9th grade will graduate on time and go on to enroll in college.
- > 50% of DPS graduates who enroll in college will require remediation.
- ▶ 64% of African American and Latino students graduated from high school compared to 78% of Caucasian students.

Without improved access to postsecondary education, Denver's at-risk youth simply cannot compete in the region's workforce. Arrupe Jesuit helps to reverse these patterns by providing an affordable college preparatory education to hundreds of students who would not have this opportunity otherwise.

CORPORATE WORK STUDY PROGRAM (CWSP)

- > 142 partner organizations, including 10 companies who have been with us since our founding as well as 18 new companies for the 2018-2019 school year.
- All students participate in job sharing full-time, entry level jobs by working 5 days per month.

> Students will earn over \$2.6 million through their CWSP jobs in the 2018-19 school year, which is nearly 50% of the cost of their college preparatory education.

Students are employees of CWSP. Arrupe Jesuit's staff handles all payroll, W-4, I-9, workers' compensation and other employer services for students.

Arrupe Jesuit trains the students, provides transportation to and from their job site, and works with partner organizations to assign motivated, enthusiastic student workers who can best meet an organization's business needs.





ARRUPE JESUIT HIGHLIGHTS & RESULTS

- > 100% of Arrupe Jesuit's first twelve graduating classes were accepted into at least one college or university of their choice, with the most recent Class of 2018 earning more than \$13.2 million in merit & community based scholarships.
- > Average daily school attendance is 96% and average daily work attendance is 98% (100% with make-ups)
- > 90% retention of companies year-to-year
- > 96% of students received a rating of good, very good or outstanding by their CWSP supervisors in the 2017-2018 school year
- > 783 alumni who together have earned over \$56 million in scholarship dollars
- > 70% College Persistence as of December 2016 (defined as either currently enrolled in college courses or have earned degree or certificate)

- The 323 students in the Class of 2007-2012 received scholarships totaling \$15,756,016
