MISSION OF ARRUPE JESUIT

Arrupe Jesuit High School is a Catholic, college preparatory school offering students with limited economic resources a premier educational experience through rigorous academics, formation in faith and discernment, and a unique work study program – fostering community, opportunity, leadership, and personal growth.

Arrupe Jesuit is an independent school sponsored by the Jesuits of the USA Central and Southern Province. The school is accredited by Cognia, and is a member of the Jesuit Schools Network (JSN) and the Cristo Rey Network (CRN).

◇ 78% of Arrupe Jesuit families qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program

◇ Average income for a family of four is between \$46,000 and \$47,000 annually

◇ 100% of Arrupe Jesuit students receive financial support towards their tuition costs

◇ Overall, 70% of graduating seniors are the first in their families to graduate from high school

◇ Overall, 90% of graduates are the first in their families to go on to college



CORPORATE WORK STUDY PROGRAM (CWSP)

- ◇ 122 partner organizations, including five companies who have been with us since our founding in 2003 as well as 21 new companies this year.
- ◇ Students participate in job sharing full-time, entry level jobs by working five days per month.
- ◇ Students will earn over \$2.3 million through their CWSP jobs in the 2023-2024 school year to support the costs of their AJHS education.
- ◇ Students are employees of CWSP. Arrupe Jesuit's staff handles all payroll, W-4, I-9, workers' compensation and other employer services for students.
- ◇ Arrupe Jesuit trains the students, provides transportation to and from their job site, and works with partner organizations to assign motivated, enthusiastic student workers who can best meet an organization's business needs.

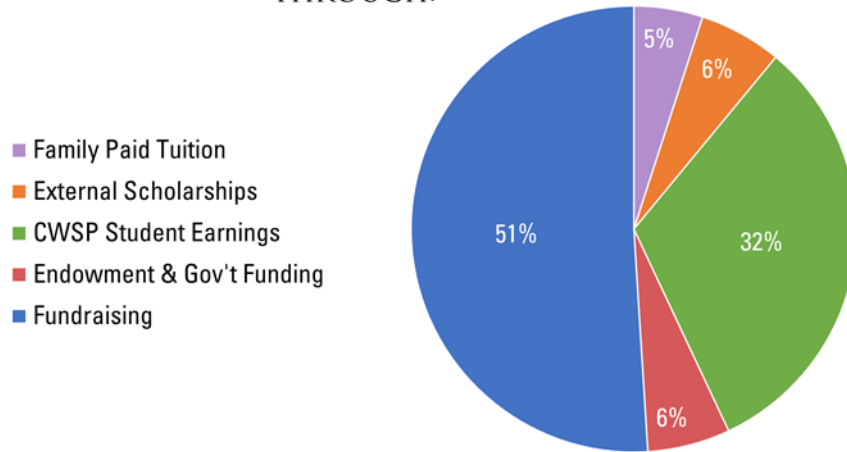

ARRUPE JESUIT HIGHLIGHTS AND RESULTS

- ◇ 100% of Arrupe Jesuit's seventeen graduating classes were accepted into at least one college or university of their choice, with the most recent Class of 2023 earning more than \$21.1 million in merit and community based scholarships.
- ◇ 1,267 alumni who together have earned over \$143.2 million in scholarships.
- ◇ Over \$30 Million earned from Corporate Work Study job placements through June 2023
- ◇ 90% of graduating seniors enroll in college the fall immediately following their graduation
- ◇ College Persistence rate of 58% as of May 2023 (defined as either currently enrolled in college courses or have earned degree or certificate), a rate three times that of demographic peers.

**Pre-pandemic, college persistence was 65%+and this decrease is a result of the challenges associated with Covid-19. Ongoing efforts of our Alumni Support Program seek to reengage those students most impacted in their post-secondary pursuits.*
