LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



As I look back on the last twenty years and give thanks for the incredible school we call home, I am reminded of the graces upon which our community was founded. The determination to build on behalf of those who couldn't build for themselves; the courage and fearlessness required to move forward without the reassurance provided by definitive answers; the belief in a better tomorrow for everyone; the love and selflessness that has always defined our school. These are the foundational characteristics of Arrupe Jesuit, and they are the characteristics that continue to inspire us today.

We opened Arrupe to fulfill a promise, to make good on a shared commitment to serve families who sought a Jesuit, Catholic high school experience for their children, but did not have access to that opportunity. We opened Arrupe because our hearts are moved by Christ's love and our hands are moved by Christ's call to love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

You, our friends, have always known that our school is driven by the desire to share with families and students the tradition of Jesuit formation that has been transformative in our own lives. Fr. Arrupe's invitation to be Women and Men for Others is rooted in our own experience of God's love and mercy, in our experience of salvation that Christ bestowed upon us through His birth, His suffering & death, and His resurrection.

To respond to our experience of that love - made evident in so many of the blessings we enjoy - is to embrace our neighbor and to live with others in mind.

For the last 20 years, Arrupe Jesuit has written a story of hope on Utica Street, a story whose chapters tell incredible tales of fortitude, brilliance, joy, and, most especially, love. For our friends and partners, Arrupe - in many ways - is the story of your love, of your openness to Christ's call that we serve our neighbor, and the passion with which you have responded to that truth.

The stories you'll read in this report offer highlights from our work, but they cannot tell the full story of Arrupe Jesuit. The full story, of course, is measured by the impact that Arrupe has each day on our students, and it's the beauty of that story that drives us to envision a greater Arrupe Jesuit, one built upon the lessons learned in these first twenty years.

Read more about their family history that inspires our students today:

With very large families each, George and Susie grew up blocks away from one another in the then low-income neighborhood of North Denver. They met for the first time in 7th grade in 1951 at Cole Junior High School and became High School sweethearts while attending Manual High School. They fell in love and were married in 1959 at Annunciation Church and remained deeply in love while raising their four girls.

Dedication to their faith, family and getting a quality education for their girls were their top priorities. George and Susie knew too well, opportunity wasn't always distributed equally but with hard work and discipline anything was possible, backed up by a great education.

George worked as a mailman for 45 years and Susie worked in a manufacturing plant while raising their daughters. Like many Arrupe family members, George also frequently worked 3 extra jobs to make ends meet. They wanted a better life for their children and made significant sacrifices.



All the hard work and sacrifice paid off. In only two generations, they turned thier dreams into a reality. From a family with no college graduates to one with 13 grandchildren who are now all college graduates, they are certainly smiling down with pride. What an amazing accomplishment.

CARRIE CONNELLY English Department

HEAD CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK COACH



Ms. Connelly is a first-year Sophomore English Teacher at Arrupe Jesuit High School and is a beloved member of the Arrupe family, by both staff and students alike. While this is technically Carrie's first year on the teaching faculty, it's not where her story with the school began.

After graduating from Georgetown University in 2020, during the midst of the Pandemic, Carrie was drawn to explore a career in teaching, and the breath of fresh air that Denver had to offer. A friend of hers recommended joining the Alumni Service Corps (ASC) as a pathway and as soon as she heard about the Cristo Rey model she "fell in love with the idea of working at Arrupe," Connelly recalls.





Joining the Arrupe Jesuit community in the midst of Covid was challenging, but Carrie expressed that she was grateful for the opportunity. As an ASC, her primary responsibility was to aid the teachers in their classrooms. So, on inperson learning days, she was able to observe different teaching styles within every department in the building. She remembers being "immediately welcomed and supported upon her arrival" and over time, "found that the faculty and staff were invested in her development as a teacher" which struck her as unique for a volunteer.

Carrie finished her ASC year and returned back to the East Coast to pursue adventures closer to her family. However, by the time the 2022-23 school year had started, she noticed there was an open teaching position in the English Department and was determined to get back to Denver and Arrupe. "I loved this community and Denver so much, but honestly, my decision to come back was mostly because of my appreciation for the students and the fact that the faculty and staff had been so supportive of me and my development. The administration was so quick to show their gratitude and encouragement and the students were so loving. I knew Arrupe was going to be the perfect environment for me as a new solo-teacher."

Her inspiration with the school lies in its Jesuit mission and tradition and with the students that "make her want to get out of bed every morning and come to school."




Ximena Gonzalez, class of 2020, is currently pursuing a degree in nursing at Regis University as a Daniels Fund Scholar.


